In relation to our supply chains, we make little use of services demanding unskilled labor, and the products and services we do consume are sourced from reputable suppliers. We remain vigilant to ensure this remains the case and require a high standard of ethics from our vendors and contractors worldwide. We will continue to review our vendor contracts and sourcing processes periodically to ensure that our zero-tolerance policy towards slavery, unlawful child labor, and human trafficking is upheld.

This statement is for the 2017-2018 financial year, in accordance with section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It shall be reviewed again in May 2018.
